The Pope and the Youth

Pope Francis wrapped up his encounter with newly confirmed youngsters in Milan, Italy, by focusing on the importance of education and formation. "Education is head-hands-heart," he said, reminding teachers and trainers that "children also need to play, to have fun, to rest."

The Pope concluded with a strong appeal to defeat bullying and invited the tens of thousands of young people to reflect in silence, as to whether there is someone who teases them, and whether they are ever mean or aggressive toward others. He asked them to promise the Lord to never be bullies or allow others to be victims of bullies.
